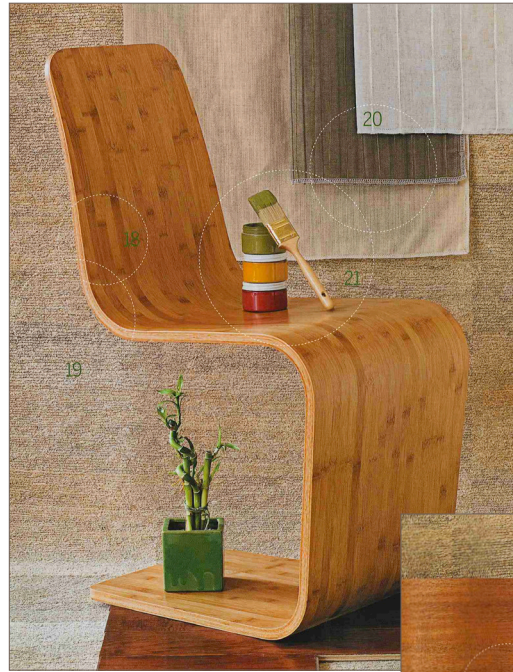

18 **New Wave Rocker** Engineered from a nine-ply laminated sheet of fast-growing, quickly replenished bamboo, the sinuous, molded Spring chair rocks your world gently. Comfortable, flexible, and indelibly cool, this seat is available in natural (shown), ebony, and cherry finishes. \$690; modernbamboo.com

19 **Clay Underfoot** Alternating bands of red and teardrop-angled hemp fibers give the Checkerboard from Classic Rugs' New Natural Collection its subtle patterning. 100 knots per square inch make it stand up to plenty of traffic. Four standard sizes, ranging from 4 by 6 feet to 8 by 10 feet. \$1,295-\$4,500; classicrugs.com

20 **Fab Fabrics** Say "natural window coverings," and most people think of roll-up multicolor blinds or canvas drapery panels. That's because they haven't been. EarthWeave fabrics, handmade from natural fibers including linen, silk, and bamboo, then tailored into Roman shades, panel screens, curtains, and valances. Custom order; hthshades.com

21 **Vegetable and Mineral** With natural egg resin as a base, mineral pigments as colorants, and few synthetic additives, Green Planet Paints' zero-VOC matte interior clay paints translate a green sensibility into 43 rich, vibrant colors that can be sprayed, rolled, or brushed on. \$45.50 per gallon; greenplanetpaints.com

22 **Sophisticated Science** Elegance and ecological savvy merge in the subtle Florence scene. Its compact fluorescent lamp is diffused under a cylindrical wooden shade made from recycled postindustrial hardwood veneer lined with chlorine-free paper. Bird's-eye maple, mahogany, bamboo, or arge (shown) on a steel base. \$195; qbrng.com

23 **Versatile Tile** First came tongue-and-groove strips, then engineered planks. Now there's something new in bamboo mosaic tile. Use it anywhere you'd use ceramic tile (except in the shower), to warm up a wall or add interest to a floor. Walker Zanger's first-of-its-kind Sobu collection comes in random planking (shown), 1-inch squares, and rectangles set in basket weave or herringbone patterns. In Gold, Satin, or Espresso finish. 24 **Slice of History** You don't need a bricklayer to get the look of antique masonry. Vintage Brick Salvage slices reclaimed Chicago common bricks into thin veneer for walls and flooring. Laid as easily as tile, it brings a touch of authenticity to a traditional family room or a modern loft. Colors range from deep pink to pale buff. 25 **Out of the Woods** EcoTimber's hand-scraped history flooring cleans up the engineered wood category with 100 percent Forest Stewardship Council-certified wood and formaldehyde-free adhesives that emit no harmful VOCs into the air. \$11-\$12 per square foot; ecotimber.com
