Silk, wool, cotton and linen are common selections, but you might consider some other natural-fiber window treatment options

1. **Blue paper Mink** from Oriental Furniture.com. Fiber light weight still draping nicely. Not alone it smooth, crinkly and thin yet strong and durable for home. It made from sturdy mulberry tree bark. The Mink is 72 inches long and come in 24, 36, 48, 60 and 72 inch widths in Cherry Blossom, Olive Green and Bamboo Tree (all shown) as well as other solid colors.
2. **Completes the look of natural-fiber draperies by adding the fabric to curtains too.** Sustainably harvested from the back of golden brown. It is often used in a cornice and drapes panels over a great-look Roman fold shade in Crown (shown No. 176). COMANDHIDES.COM.
3. **Harrier Douglas' Providence** collection uses woven wood with bamboo, reed and grass for rich-looking color combine like this structural element. This set is warm, relaxed dimension to any room - whether they're hanging flat or rolled, creating an airy, sweeping flow."
